Mystery Shopping

The group talked about Mystery shopping, where they would go and why they would go...



Where?

- Food, clothes and Charity shops
- Bus and Train Stations
- Leisure Centres
- Police Stations (what happens when you walk in?)
- Café's, Restaurant and Bars
- Doctors and Hospitals



Why?

- Is there a sensory overload?
- Do staff help?
- Do quiet hours work? do they really happen?
- Have they got signs?
- Do they have pictures?
- Do you need to read?
- Can I get in? is there steps?
- Have they got lifts if you can't climb stairs or steps?
- Can I park nearby?



We talked about letting the places we mystery shop know what we think. Dave explained 'Nice Twice'. If we go and its good, we tell them, if it isn't good we tell them and go back to see if they have made it better • this is called accountability.



Hospital Passports

The board have spoken about Patient or hospital Passports before and how they help hospital staff understand what we can and can't do, what we like and don't like etc.
