
The Goddards

Mystery Shopping

The group talked about Mystery shopping, where they would go and why they would go...



Where?

- Food, clothes and Charity shops
- Bus and Train Stations
- Leisure Centres
- Police Stations (what happens when you walk in?)
- Café's, Restaurant and Bars
- Doctors and Hospitals



Why?

- Is there a sensory overload?
- Do staff help?
- Do quiet hours work? do they really happen?
- Have they got signs?
- Do they have pictures?
- Do you need to read?
- Can I get in? is there steps?
- Have they got lifts if you can't climb stairs or steps?
- Can I park nearby?



We talked about letting the places we mystery shop know what we think. Dave explained 'Nice Twice'.

If we go and its good, we tell them, if it isn't good we tell them and go back to see if they have made it better 😊 - this is called accountability.



Hospital Passports

The board have spoken about Patient or hospital Passports before and how they help hospital staff understand what we can and can't do, what we like and don't like etc.

Ankur told us about his family experience when a family member went to the hospital. Ankur made a patient passport to help them at the appointment.

 	<p>Ankur was surprised that the hospital didn't already know about the diagnosis. He asked the hospital to keep a copy of the patient passport he had made so that this could be used at the next / other appointments. The hospital was only able to use the passport at this appointment.</p> <p>The group talked about what would happen if they forgot the passport if they went to hospital?</p> <p>The group asked, why doesn't the GP or Receptionist know about Learning disability?</p> <p>We talked about how important it was to have an Annual Health Check (sometimes called a health screen).</p> <p>The board felt it important for someone to come and talk to us about patient passports and we could ask questions.</p> <p>Ankur also talked about the Oliver McGowan Training. (It is mandatory, that means it must be done if you work in Health or Social Care).</p> <p>Ankur and Rachel told us that when they had been to the hospital the staff did not know about the Oliver McGowan Training.</p> <p>One staff didn't know what neuro diverse means.</p>	<p>Trish To invite Health and share information</p>
	<p>Preparing for Adulthood - PfA</p> <p>Hannah Brown shared a video that was made with the help of the TYLER group (The Young Leaders of the East Riding) who are aged 14-25 years old.</p> <p>The group found the video very interesting, very good, lovely and cool!
