

Peter told us that the council had £154 million last year and £166 million this year to spend on Adult Social Care. No one has told him how it will be spent yet.



Friendly Faces Officers Hull OTT MASSESST	Friendly Faces costs £6 for entry and activities. Food and drink costs more. (It's on each week)	çob
Red	RED has stayed £5 for entry and food and drinks cost more. They have discos and sometimes singers.	
Social Club	When we want to go to social clubs, we must pay for the club staff to go with us, transport, drinks Less people go now, they don't have enough money.	
	People that live in Residential Care might only have £25 left after their bills, and they use that for toiletries, treats, holidays, clothes, activities	
	Oliver McGowan Training (Julia) Julia told us that health and social care staff must complete the face-to-face training (Tier 2). It will help staff to listen and respect our choices.	
	Julia told us about how Oliver died and that his mum, Paula wants to stop this happening to anybody else.	
	Oliver died because doctors didn't listen to Oliver or read his notes or Hospital Passport. Julia has visited places that are doing the training, and their staff have visited Julia - the training must be the same for everyone.	Everyone Tell Trish if you want to be an expert or trainer
	1200 council staff will start doing their training from June.	
	We still need experts and facilitators – tell us if you want to learn.
