

Main Discussion Topics

A. Housing Challenges

- · Long waiting times for suitable housing,
- Difficulties with council processes
- Issues with private renting.
- Barriers include lack of available housing, prioritization rules, and challenges for those with mental health needs.







B. Mental Health & Wellbeing

- Experiences of anxiety, depression, and strategies for coping (e.g., going out, hobbies, socializing, medication).
- The importance of support networks and knowing where to seek help (e.g., 111, crisis teams) was highlighted.



C. Social Activities & Community Involvement

- Members talked about activities that help them feel good: going to the pub, charity shops, outings, holidays, and hobbies like diamond art.
- Red Nights and Gig Buddies: Volunteerled social initiatives for people with learning disabilities, offering accessible events and social opportunities.
- Discussion about how to join, what's involved, and the benefits of these schemes.





D. Transport Issues

- Confusion over eligibility and use of free travel passes for buses and trains.
- Some members still pay for travel due to unclear rules or lack of the right pass.
- Plans to invite transport officers to future meetings to clarify entitlements and improve accessibility.
- Concerns about bus drivers' training in supporting people with additional needs.



E. Health & Annual Checks

- Discussion about annual health checks, cancer screening, and the importance of regular check-ups.
- Some members find the process confusing or intimidating, especially with new technology (e.g., check-in machines at GP surgeries).
- There are resources like easy-read guides and videos to help demystify health procedures.



F. Oliver McGowan Training

- Several members are trainers for the Oliver McGowan mandatory training (focused on autism and learning disability awareness for health and social care staff).
- Issues discussed: session cancellations, payment for trainers, and the need to



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	expand training to more community staff (e.g., bus drivers).

Discussed ongoing challenges in accessing supported housing, the development of a new housing strategy, and the importance of incorporating user feedback and lived experiences into planning.

o Communication and Support Challenges:

Examples of poor communication from council staff were shared, such as last-minute cancellations and lack of clear explanations, highlighting the need for better support and face-to-face interactions for people with communication differences.



o Future Involvement and Feedback
Mechanisms: Plans were made to involve
the Futures Plus team and other
relevant groups in the strategy
development process, ensuring a broad
range of voices are included in shaping
supported housing policy.
