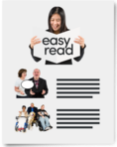
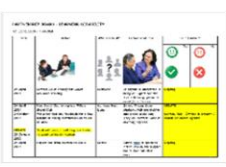

	Capital Grant - Rani This is money to make something for people with learning disabilities. The NHS and the East Riding Council are looking to create - - Somewhere for respite - Somewhere to learn new skills - Somewhere to learn to be independent - Somewhere to go when people leave long term hospitals and need support - Somewhere for care and support - Somewhere to trial independent living They did think about making this in Bridlington but are looking to see if anywhere else is better.	
  	Housing update- Simon Fenwick New supported living and extra care housing planned. Expected from 2027. Driffield - • Riverside, Riverside Close, near River Head - 10 flats. INVOLVE Care is the Landlord • White House, Beverley Road near the Train station, 8 flats. EMPOWERED LIVES • Extra Care Housing, Allotment Lane - 68 flats, with a Coffee Bar, Restaurant, Communal Spaces etc. Beyond Housing is the Landlord. - Supported Living with Beverley Housing Charity
- Queensgate - 8 flats
- Railway Street, near the Station, 6 flats
- Bead House on Lairgate, 2 flats
- Minster Towers, Extra cover

More options are being looked at.

Difference between Extra care and Supported Living?

- Extra Care = Care and Support for people when it is needed
- Supported Living = staff on site 24 hours



How can I apply for one of these?

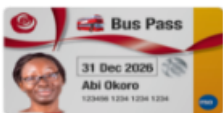
- Social Worker will refer you to Housing Options
- You can tell them which houses you would like to be in
- Apply quickly, even when they are not built

How do you decide where to build the options?

- We look at the areas where people are asking to live
- We look at transport that is there
- Housing developments make sure that there are enough GPs, Dentists etc. and pay towards new roads and facilities.

Easy Read Information about Bus Passes - Gary, Suzana

Bus Pass explained...

Blue Stripe = Elderly pass, so must be 66 years old

Yellow Stripe = Disabled pass with or without carer, need to have one of these-

- Learning disabilities
- Partially sighted or Blind = Bus pass
- Blind = Bus and Train pass
- Profound disabilities = Bus and Train pass
- Medically unfit e.g. has Epilepsy or severe Mental Health problems = Bus pass
- Speech impaired or profound deaf = Bus pass



	• Injured causing disability or difficulty walking e.g. no limbs = Bus pass • War pensioner = Bus pass Autism - does not qualify for a Bus pass, but, if they have other problems e.g. medically unfit to drive = Bus pass Bus pass applications can be made by Social Workers, Futures+ ACTIONS Trish and Lee will make an easy read leaflet to share Any questions ask Gary, Suzana or Trish on the email	Trish, Lee
