Active communities, health and wellbeing co-ordinators – have a role in building active communities.




Being able to do things in your community stops people from being lonely.

Stronger Together Sessions



Liane said how great it is that people have a strong voice in the Learning Disability Partnership and in the East Riding we need to make sure everyone can speak up.

How can we help people to have their say?

Lianne shared with the group that Rebecca had provided information about a course about becoming strong selfadvocates and how to speak up for themselves.

Liane said she is looking to find the money to be able to provide the course in East Riding.

Paul suggested getting staff together to look at what people don't need and sell items to raise money.



Anna said she went to the Goddards at 18 – Rachel said I'd come on from 18 – 43 really well, - Liane said Anna should be proud of herself.



We hope to have people like Conrad, Paul, Anthony, Mandy and Anna to take part in the training.

Peter asked people to find other self-advocates from big towns across East Riding to tell them about the course if it happens.

	 Peter talked about the Bridlington Living Well sessions and the health and wellbeing team. They want to run some sessions around the Goole area and invite people

Dentist	NHS dentist appointments. Some people had chosen to go to private dentists which is expensive
	 Care Quality Commission Inspection (CQC): Liane shared that East Riding local authority is due to have a Care Quality Commission inspection –
CareQuality Commission	CQC check local councils to make sure they are doing a good job and people are cared for well



There is going to be Peer Review which will be about "Preparing for Adulthood".

This Peer Review will help the Council get ready for the CQC Inspection.

People will be able talk about the Partnership Board and say the difference its making.



 GP Appointments - getting appointments is still difficult, people having to hang on the phone for ages. Paul said he decided to walk to the Doctors and see them face to face rather than hang on the phone. Getting to the pharmacy seems to be the problem.
 Well done to Paul.



 Lots of things have changed since Covid – there is a big shortage. We all need help to work through the system and ask for help. People are working hard to make changes.

Peter said reasonable adjustment should be made. Reasonable adjustments are talked about in the Oliver McGowan training.



Neil said that next time you speak to your GP remember to tell them what might help you to get an appointment as they are offering lots of different options. If you can walk in this may be the best option for you, so you don't have to do everything on the phone.



If you are not happy and think reasonable adjustments are not being made let us know.



People who support people with a learning disability can download the NHS app for booking appointments, this means people don't have to hang on the phone if they are supporting someone.

Neil suggested on-line apps to make appointments or prescriptions. NHS apps <u>https://bitly.ws/TFs9</u>
Sue said support staff are trying to help but they don't have enough time to spend on the phone but they need to keep chasing for appointments. This can delay treatment.
Sue said chasing up medical results was a bit problem.
Peter suggested a sheet with helpful questions – Neil to have a conversation with Peter.
Some self-advocates had difficulties with their medication and what it looked like. Suggested Pharmacy should be contacted – Mandy will do this.
